Beaded Rings

Collect

Bible, chenille wires, scissors, pony beads.

Prepare

Cut each chenille wire into four pieces, one piece for each child.

Do

Children string beads on chenille wires. Help children wrap chenille wires around fingers to make rings. Briefly tell today's Bible story.




Enrichment Ideas

Talk Aboat

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The Loving Father Luke 15:11-24
